

Letter from Rob Hatfield



I am happy to report to you that we have met and exceeded our goal for the Annie Armstrong missions offering for North American missions. Our goal was \$24,000 and we have given \$27,707. I praise God for His faithful provision and for your willingness to support the ongoing work of our North American Mission Board (NAMB). As a

reminder, we do not keep any of these funds that have been given, but instead send directly through our missions partners in the Southern Baptist Convention. While you are on the site, I also encourage you to check out different ways that you can be involved in North American Missions through prayer and by going to serve.

Speaking of opportunities, I hope you and your family are planning to take advantage of the wonderful chance we will have on April 21 for food, fellowship and fun. We will have a shrimp boil from 5:00 pm - 6:30 pm with musical entertainment provided by Three on a String. When we began having services in our dining hall, however, we lost the opportunity for those who worship in our contemporary service to either participate in or witness this momentous occasion as a normal part of worship. This will change very soon as we will have a portable baptistry for use in the dining hall. The portable nature of this baptistry is appropriate for that space as it can be used when needed and stored when it is not needed, thus allowing the space to be used for other ongoing ministry needs at other times. I am excited for both of our services to again have the ordinance of baptism as a normal and regular part of our times of worship and look forward to the first time of usage!
