Letter from Rob Hatfield



As a little boy I would go and stay with my paternal grandparents for a week at a time in the summer. Over the course of years, I was in the room or at the table during a variety of conversations about life between my grandparents. They weren't really talking to me, but they were open about their discussion, so I could hear their reasoning and

interaction. One particular conversation was about giving, and sacrificial giving in particular. As far as they were concerned, giving a tithe (or ten percent) of their income was never an option. But it also wasn't an ending point of their giving! They knew God was the real owner of everything they had and that they were stewards of it all, so they had to seriously consider what He wanted them to do with every dime of resources they had.

Practically speaking, they talked about what they needed financially and what could be given up financially. These conversations would arise especially when there was a particular need in the church they wanted to give towards. They would discuss what they could sacrifice in order to give more generously. The conversation of sacrifice was not held in ill will or in frustrated tones, but rather with reverence, prayer, and even joy! As the conversation continued, I knew they would identify something they were willing to do without for a short time or in general in order to give more. Sacrifice was not a dirty word; it was expected as a normal part of Christian life and held in high regard.

How do you view sacrificial giving, giving that requires you to relinquish something in order to further the work of the Kingdom? Is sacrificing financially for the Lord a joy for you? It was for the Christians in Macedonia written about in 2 Corinthians 8:3-4. Paul writes, "For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the saints." My grandparents' conversations resound in my heart and mind as Laurie and I look at our own finances. I pray that we will all join together in exercising our privilege and joy to sacrificially give!

A TESTIMONY FOR TITHING

".5 Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. 6 These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

My tithing testimony is best illustrated by the verses above. I grew up in a Christian household where both parents faithfully tithed, regardless of our financial situation. There were some lean times financially when my dad would work 2 or 3 jobs to make ends meet, but in good times and bad times, my parents never failed to tithe ... and God was faithful.

When Tim and I got married, Tim had recently become a Christian just six months before our wedding. During out first month of marriage, I was paying bills one evening and Tim asked why I was writing "that check" to the church. I explained to him about tithing and the example that my parents had set for me. Tim's response was "okay," and we've never looked back. It hasn't always been easy – especially in the early days of our marriage – but we both agreed tithing wasn't negotiable. Again, God has always been faithful. Tithing has given us the opportunity to see God reveal Himself in some really special ways.

It is Tim's and my prayer that our children will follow the example we have faithfully tried to provide for them, just as my parents so faithfully provided for me.
