

# Letter from Rob Hatfield



The Annie Armstrong
Missions offering for North
American Missions has been
a part of my life as long as I
can remember. Growing up at
Dawson Memorial Baptist, I
received white envelopes with
each Sunday's date inscribed
on the upper right hand corner,
but there were also special
envelopes that were printed on
colored paper that were included

in the box. Those colored envelopes corresponded to offerings that were in addition to our normal tithes. The money given for the Annie Armstrong offering is used to directly support North American Missions endeavors. This means that 100% of the funds given go to missions causes around North America.

While I participated in these offerings as a child, I don't think I understood their full importance until I was in college. In the summer of my Sophomore and Junior year of college I served as a summer missionary through the North American Mission Board. After my sophomore year I served in Salt Lake City, Utah, and after my junior year I served in Anchorage, Alaska. The North American Mission Board uses some of its funding to pay for the travel, food, and lodging costs as well as a small stipend for college-student missionaries each summer. Through that funding I was able to share the gospel with many, to help local churches in need of workers, and gain valuable experience which has shaped my perspective on missions and ministry since then. My experience during those summers was so wonderful that I have

encouraged dozens of college students over the years to participate in the program as well, and they also report God's blessings. This is just ONE of the many ways that your offering to the North American Mission Board through the Annie Armstrong Easter offering is utilized for the Kingdom. Mile City's name is a nod to Detroit's mile-focused grid system. At the end of every service, the pastor who never wanted to speak publicly challenges the congregation to pray for the city every time they see a mile marker.


