

Letter from Rob Hatfield



An internet phenomenon is currently capturing our attention over a brief sound clip. The clip features a voice speaking, and listeners either hear the name "Laurel" or "Yanny". You can google it and try it for yourself!

I certainly don't claim to understand the science behind the exact same name producing a

different reaction in people, but I will tell you that I have seen it occur time and again in my life over another name – Jesus. What do you hear when you hear this name? C.S. Lewis wrote about this in Mere Christianity with the understanding that many didn't really know who Jesus was or had taken the time to thoroughly investigate the claims made about Him in scripture.

"I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: 'I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God.' That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about his being a great human teacher. He has


not left that open to us. He did not intend to. ... Now it seems to me obvious that He was neither a lunatic nor a fiend: and consequently, however strange or terrifying or unlikely it may seem, I have to accept the view that He was and is God."


This line of thought from Lewis is often referred to as the Lord, liar, or lunatic trilemma. Often times people who I have encountered have not spent the time needed to truly examine the claims of Jesus in scripture. They live at a superficial knowledge of this name and consequently understand it in various categories like a cuss word, a historical fiction, a teacher, or a leader of a religion, but as scripture is examined, they begin to wonder what the name of Jesus could truly mean. Eventually many come to moments of choice similar to the ones proposed by Lewis. Some choose to follow Jesus as Lord and hear His name forever differently.

How do you hear the name of Jesus? What about the people in your sphere of influence? Do they have enough knowledge to make a genuine choice, or do they need someone to help them see what scripture says?

Cost: Volleyball - \$90 before July 26 (\$100 after July 26), Football - (\$90 before July 20 (\$100 after July 20)






Weightloss Summer Challenge Class
