

Letter from Rob Hatfield



Two seemingly unrelated events (one personal and another from the world) from this week have reminded me once again of a critical truth in Christianity.

On Monday I began to feel the indicators in my body that I was getting a cold. I fought against the itchy throat, sinus pain,

body aches and fatigue until I gave in on Tuesday night and admitted I was sick. I slept most of the day on Wednesday, allowing my body the time and rest it needed to turn the corner (a special thanks to Terry for speaking on Wednesday evening in my stead) and recover. While I am not fully recovered today, I feel WAY better than I did and am hopefully on the way to mending completely soon.

Though it is only a week later, our country is again bracing for a storm of significant strength. At this moment, there are forecasts that predict the "storm of a lifetime" from Hurricane Florence with devastation that rivals that of any storm in our nation's past. Time will tell if these predictions are accurate. I am hopeful they are inaccurate, and I am praying for God's protection of those who are in the storm's path. I invite you to join me in those prayers.

What do these two unrelated events have in common? Both are pictures of life on this side of eternity. On this side of heaven we will have pain, sickness, suffering and even death. Whenever I get sick I can't help but to think of a time when there will

be no more sickness or pain because a new day will have arrived. Whenever I see storms of enormous impact, I am reminded of Romans 8:18-20, which tells us that creation itself is groaning under the consequences of sin and looking forward to that future as well - to a time when the curse of sin is no more. Revelation 21:3-4 says at that time "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

Days of suffering are hard. They are, however, a reminder that as believers in our resurrected Lord Jesus, we have something much better to look forward to. We are not there yet, and there may be days of suffering between now and then, but we can rest assured that our Lord will be with us in the midst of those storms even as He leads us home.

More about Dr. Martha Myers...

Dr. Martha, as she was called, spent 25 years working tirelessly to bring healing and hope to the country of Yemen through her speciality as an OB/GYN. She was well known among the people in Jibla, as well as areas farther out from the main city. She was determined to reach the unreached, often walking for hours in terrain so rugged her Land Rover couldn't traverse it. She would walk into an area, set up a little clinic and see patients until she was beyond exhausted and the light of day began to fade to evening. This was her regular practice, and her loving touch earned the respect and admiration of the locals far and near.

It was this belief that every person matters—that every person created by God has dignity and worth—that drew so many to Christ. And sadly, it was this same belief that ultimately caused a member of an al-Qaida cell in Jibla to be filled with such rage and fear that he burst into the hospital on December 30, 2002, and murdered Dr. Martha and two other American missionaries.

Instead of stopping the Gospel, his heinous act served to highlight its power. The testimony of Dr. Martha and her slain colleagues continues to impact the Yemeni people in untold ways. The life she lived there overshadows the death she died, and Christ continues to be glorified through her sacrifice.
