Letter from Rob Hatfield



It is full on decoration mode at the church these days. As I sit in my office I can hear the drills and hammers at work in the sanctuary. The two Christmas trees are standing with lights on in the sanctuary, and there are also "contemporary" Christmas trees in the dining hall for our 8:30 contemporary service. There is still a good bit of work to be done, but preparations are well under way to have both venues

ready to begin Advent season on Sunday.

The decorations are certainly not the only items being worked on. A little known fact is that our organ and pianos are tuned each year in preparation for the Christmas season. Some of the decoration team (whom I hope you will thank profusely for their hard work) and I shared a good laugh about the tedious process of tuning the organ one half-note at a time. The precision needed to make every note perfect is astounding. However, if you were to overhear this tuning process, you would likely find it a bit unnerving and could be unappreciative of each note.

When I read the beginning of the Christmas story in Matthew, starting with the genealogy of Jesus, I can't help but be amazed by the tedious and meticulous manner in which God kept His word to Abraham, which was given in Genesis 12:3 that "all peoples on earth will be blessed through him (Abraham)." Matthew 1:1 begins, "A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ the son of David, the son of Abraham." From that verse, every ancestor of Jesus' family is traced back. The verses seem a bit tedious. We are perhaps tempted to skip to the "good part" when the narrative begins, but we would do well not to skip past generations of God's working to get everything right, of His tuning every event to be just right for Jesus' arrival. While many questioned God's timing and preparations, no Christian would question the end result. A moment when history played like a symphony.

I am thankful for the organ and piano tuners and their intricate behind-the-scenes work. I certainly don't understand it, but I do appreciate it when it comes together. In the same way, I am so thankful that we have a God who was at work behind the scenes to enable His Son to come into the world, and I'm thankful that same God is still at work today. Make no mistake about it— God is preparing the way for His Son to return again!

Final Days of the 4th Quarter


