

Letter from Rob Hatfield



aleb, my 5 year-old son, loves his bedtime routine. It is true that he has always known the value of sleep and has sometimes been known to announce (without prompting) that he is tired and needs to go to bed. It is also true that he loves the time we spend together before he gets into bed. A key component of that time is story time. No matter if Laurie or I am in charge of

him, the routine is constant. He gets to pick the book that we read (sometimes the adult reads, sometimes Caleb reads, and sometimes we both read - taking turns being the voices for different characters). Caleb loves the stories. Sometimes the stories teach him things, sometimes he goes on adventures with the characters, sometimes they make him laugh, and sometimes he feels concern or sadness for one of the characters, but then he tells us (and himself) that it will be ok in the end. Everybody will be ok, and he reads on.

This past Sunday we began a series of sermons that will take us through the books of Acts together. The theme of the book is stated clearly in Acts 1:8: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Luke, the author of Acts, tells the story of how the early Christians were empowered by the Holy Spirit and used by the Lord to proclaim the gospel in the world. The stories we will read have many teaching parts, many adventurous parts, and some parts where the characters involved face significant peril. Along the way we will see how the church began, and how early Christians responded to the leadership of the Lord among them.

But the tales told are more than a simple account written long ago. The story of Acts is our story. It is our history, the narrative account of our people. It is also a wonderful vision of how we should be living in these days as we continue to be empowered by the Holy Spirit and spread the good news of Jesus in the world. It is finally a vision of how things will end when all who have made Jesus the Lord of their lives are saved and are, in the words of Caleb "ok in the end" (or is that the beginning?). Needless to say, I am excited about studying this book together in these days ahead!

Speaking of living in these days, in addition to continuing our study of Acts this Sunday we will be observing the Lord's Supper this Sunday in our morning worship services. I look forward to remembering what the Lord has done, reflecting on what He continues to do among us, and looking forward to what He will do in the days ahead as we celebrate the Lord's Supper together.


