hope you will indulge me this week and allow me to write about my grandmother, Mae Moore, who passed away on Tuesday morning at the age of 99. While I am admittedly baised, I believe her life illuminates choices and truths that can be an encouragement to us all.

Grandma Moore, as she was known by her many

grandchildren, did not have an easy life, but it was a long and good one. She had five children, with her last two children being twins (my mom was one of the twins). When my mom was two, her dad (Mae's husband) passed away, leaving Mae to raise the children with the help of her surrounding family. I've always known her story, but as a parent with three children of my own, I now understand more fully the enormous burden of her responsibilities.


A critical component that enabled Grandma Moore to persevere was her faith in God. Her faith was simple and deep, strengthened through the flame of adversity. She knew God would provide, and she trusted Him to do so. Grandma Moore did her part too, listening to Him and obeying even when it was difficult.

It was her obedience that would lead her to come before her congregation at Macedonia Baptist Church and tell them God had called her to be a foster parent. Over the course of the following decades, Grandma Moore would help raise some 25 foster children, some of whom I believe will be at her funeral on Saturday. If we were able to go back in time and visit her home when I was a child, you would see photo collages in her living room that had been compiled by her children,

foster children, and grandchildren. These were tangible mementos of so many children who had been loved and impacted by Mae Moore!

As Mae aged, her body eventually would not keep up with her mind. To be sure, this was difficult for a strong woman who had lived independently and had always been a doer. In one of our last conversations we talked about how tough it was. I reminded her that God had given her a unique role as the undisputed matriarch of the family. Out of the deep well of her love for others, she was still speaking words of truth, encouragement, and love to our family that no one else could. Though her body failed her, she was still able to have an impact through her words and through her prayers.

It is in times of death when we truly examine our moments of life. I hope I can depend on God no matter my circumstances. I hope I am able to be obedient to God even when it is difficult. I hope I will choose to love others even though I have no obligation to do so. I hope I will be faithful to the Lord to my last breath, always seeking His will for others.
