In my recent trip to Georgia for my Grandmother's funeral I expected to see many of my cousins whom I haven't been around for years and that, indeed, was the case. I also anticipated being in surroundings that were not familiar to me, but that had particular significance to many within my family. Again, with the funeral occurring in my Grandmother's long-time

church and burial in what amounted to an extended family graveyard across the street, the place met the expectation perfectly.


What I didn't see coming was meeting so many relatives (fourth and fifth cousins) that I had never met before. My Grandfather, Elmer Moore, tragically died at age 35 when my mom and her twin brother were two. Consequently, I haven't been around much of Elmer's extended family, but they were still very much connected to my grandmother and came in abundance to the funeral.

I also didn't expect to feel nostalgia about a place I'd never been to. I preached my Grandmother's funeral from the same pulpit where she heard God's word preached faithfully each week and in the same sanctuary where she would accept the call to be a foster parent. To say it felt surreal would be an understatement. It felt more like I was on holy ground.

On Wednesday nights, after the time we set aside to pray for those within our congregation who are hurting, we have started a new Bible study where we look at members of our family of faith as identified in scripture. We will examine who they are, how they lived, the circumstances they encountered, and how all those things relate to us today - as members of the same family. I expect that we will encounter many from the family who we know well, but perhaps haven't considered in a while, that we will "see" many familiar scenes that were important to them. I also hope, however, to look at the lives of some who we may have not ever considered and to travel to holy places to see how God has worked in the past. In the midst of these family adventures, I pray God will teach us how we can best live for him in this new generation of the family of faith. I welcome you to come on the adventure with us each Wednesday evening at 6:15!
