

Letter from Rob Hatfield



t is my joy to report that this past Friday my Dad completed his final round of radiation treatment for prostate cancer. As many of you know, my Dad's battle with prostate cancer was exacerbated by his ongoing challenges with Parkinson's Disease. Radiation treatment can oftentimes make patients feel extremely fatigued, yet a key treatment for Parkinson's is regular, ongoing exercise.

Without a doubt, the combination of the two was extremely draining for Dad, but he was simultaneously encouraged through some critical channels that I believe can help each of us no matter our struggles.

Dad decided early on not to hide either of his diagnoses. He openly communicated to those in his circles about what was going on - not in an attention seeking way, but rather because he genuinely desired their prayers and support. He had seen firsthand the power of prayer and knew he needed it in these days for healing and for the strength to carry on. Dad would be the first to tell you the Lord has already been answering those prayers in great and marvelous ways!

Dad's openness enabled those around him to have the knowledge needed to lend a hand. A dear friend of ours got word of Dad's diagnosis and decided to help organize men who were in Dad's circle to be prayer and support warriors with him each day of his 40 day treatment. These men would pick him up to transport him to the treatment, pray with him, wait for the treatment to end (about 20 minutes) and then drive him home. I got to go on the last day of the treatment and bring him to the celebration where many of the 85 men who had participated were there cheer him on. Talk about a blessing of love and

encouragement! It was overwhelming to consider the love these men chose to give my Dad.

And then there was the cancer treatment center itself. When Dad's last treatment was over, the doctor came out to talk with Dad and the men who were there the last day. He expressed how impressed he was with the dedication and love the men had shown. In addition, Dad came to recognize and get to know the other men receiving treatment because they were always there at the same time. If those men had anyone with them it was their immediate family, but in many cases they were alone. Dad told me how amazed these other patients were at the consistent love of Dad's family of faith. In fact, eventually several of the other patients and their family members were included in the circles of prayer.

In the midst of this trial the Lord spoke some clear words: be open about your struggles so others can help; seek prayer like you expect it to work; find ways to deliberately organize to love others; intentional acts of love are blessings of immense value; when the church loves like family the world really does notice; keep your eyes open for those who need that kind of love but aren't in the family of faith yet.

One last word here: if you are among those who prayed for my Dad and family during these days, thank you! We are beyond grateful for your kindness and support!
