THE CHURCH SCATTERED BEGINS THE REGATHERING JUNE 7, 2020

Sunday, June 7, Spring Hill Baptist Church begins a soft return to on campus worship.

- Contemporary Service will meet at 8:30 a.m. in the Dining Hall.
- Traditional Service will meet at 11:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary.
- There will be no on campus Sunday School or Small Groups.

Who should return?

- Those who are healthy with no compromised immunity or health issues.
- Those who feel comfortable retuning to group settings.

Who should <u>stay home</u> for awhile and watch online?

- Anyone who does not feel comfortable returning to large group settings.
- Anyone who has health issues or is compromised in any way.
- Any older senior adult.
- Anyone with a fever, cough, cold, or symptoms of covid 19 or who knows they have been exposed to the virus.

Our staff is taking steps to disinfect all surfaces. All shared or passed materials in worship have been removed. Hand sanitizer will be at each entrance.

The three ways to enter the building are:

- Through the welcome center sliding doors.
- Through the elevator side entrance off the patio area.
- Through the southeast doors off the sanctuary.

Please sit in household groups and allow at least six feet between household groups. Practice social distancing. In the sanctuary, every other pew will be left vacant. Chair rows will be separated in the contemporary service. Offering plates will be at the exits but not passed during service. Bulletins will be in each seat and will include hymn lyrics and scripture.

We are attempting to make this return as safe as possible, but please remember: You must take responsibility for your personal health and the well being of your neighbor as well.

We look forward to the time when we can return to normal worship, but this does give opportunity to begin to return as a faith community to corporate worship.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.
