I Was Born Homesick

The paragraph began with "I was born homesick." And that is where I stopped. My mind went multiple directions. I thought back to the home I grew up in, surrounded by family as a child. However, mostly it is a homesickness for the intangible. Homesickness is an emotion. A longing for safety, security, peace. A yearning for beauty and wholeness.

A kingdom where monarchs are benevolent, people are altruistic, and community and peace are precious. At times the sentiment surfaces and tears come. Fredrick Buechner in Whistling in the Dark proposes: "Whenever you find tears in your eyes, especially unexpected tears, it is well to pay the closest attention. They are not only telling you something about the secret of who you are, but more often than not God is speaking to you through them of the mystery of where you have come from and is summoning you to where, if your soul is to be saved, you should go to next." Hebrews 13:14 reads: For here we do not have a lasting city, but we are seeking the city which is to come. God has placed in us a longing for His Kingdom. When we receive it, then it is up to us to share it with others.

Now I must admit I love this world - the family, the friends and I am in no hurry to leave. Still I long for that existence that will be even greater than I can imagine. C.S. Lewis wrote: "If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world." Yes, you and I were made for another world.

Many of us are homesick for corporate worship inside 2 South McGregor Avenue. We miss our church family, we miss the liturgy of the service we attend, we miss the community in worship. Yes, we miss it because we gather, and Christ is our focus. It is a piece of the Kingdom here on earth.
