find it fascinating that for many in the church, we were old for years that our practice had become stale and inappealing. We were urged by "church experts" to do way with the churchiness, to change our venues and our approach to broaden the appeal. But what I find nteresting is that what we are now missing in this pandemic is not necessarily the entertainment value of church but the communion of saints. We miss the corporate prayers, the anthems, the hymns, the Scripture, he small group Bible study and the sharing of burdens. We miss the prayers for one another.

Some have been able to return, but it is still odd. Scattered throughout the sanctuary or dining hall separated by empty pews and seats. Congregants masked so that often we have difficulty recognizing one another. Others have chosen, and rightly so, to stay safer at home and watch live stream or delayed broadcast, but there still is a hollowness to it. So much so that many times we ust neglect to even bother to watch. Believe me I inderstand. This is a difficult time. We have lost something. Our liturgy has changed and the effort to continue seems unsatisfying.

Yet the Good News is that God has not changed. Christ s risen and His redemption for His bride continues! All else can fall away, but Christ remains. As His "called out ones" we are constantly encouraged in Scripture to join together for worship and study. We are challenged to keep pressing on. We are admonished to not give up but to spur one another on.




