#### **RESTORED**



"For He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son He loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins" (Colossians 1:13-14)

The great promise of the Bible is not just that God will restore His people, but that He will restore creation. There will be a new heaven and a new earth. We read

the accounts from the time He was on earth in the flesh of how He restored health to people and how He restored relationships between races, classes and religious groups. These occurrences were glimpses of the

creation God established in the beginning and will reinstate when all is complete.

In my reading this weekend, I came across the following hope-filled quote.

"When Jesus expels demons and heals the sick, He is driving out of creation the powers of destruction and is healing and restoring created beings who are hurt and sick. The lordship of God to which the healings witness, restores creation to health. Jesus' healings are not supernatural miracles in a natural world. They are the only truly "natural" thing in a world that is unnatural, demonized and wounded." Jurgen Moltmann, *The Way of Jesus Christ: Christology in Messianic Dimensions*.

When we begin to follow Christ, He enters our inner being and begins the work of restoration. As we begin to lean into His transformative process, we move toward the Holy. He reclaims our brokenness and just as He heals the blind man and restores his sight, Christ removes the unnatural, demonized and wounded scales revealing the inner relationship with the Father that makes us right and whole.

Now, this may have been more enlightening to me than it is to you, but for me, I gained a sense of great relief and hope. This revelation also brought a challenge. As I find myself struggling in the midst of pandemic, hurricanes, fires, national unrest, and general angst, I am reminded that these things are unnatural. Yet, they are exactly what Christ came to redeem! I am to embrace His internal transformation and, as I am transformed, be a carrier of that hope to the world. Because of His power, when I encounter the unnatural, I have the ability to not be changed by the world but to bring the restorative power of Christ into my world. With it comes the power of God, bringing what each of us desperately longs for.
