





"A merry heart does good like a medicine!

I have now been the Director of the Day School for a year. Last year was filled with so many learning and growing opportunities for me after retiring from Mobile County Public Schools to become the Director. All was good until suddenly this little thing called a pandemic popped up. The last 5 ½ months have been very busy for us. Just like every other school, business, and church this was uncharted waters. The Day School closed on March 17. As we walked out the door that afternoon, we expected to return in 2-3 weeks. As you know, that was not to be the case.

After many calls to the Health Department, hours of long work, multiple safety plans written, and many hours of prayers, we decided to reopen on May 26. We have joked that I was going to start a blog called COVID with Carole, because I have learned so much about COVID-19 in order for us to make the best decisions for our school. Our teachers had now become essential workers. Parents were counting on us to be there for the children, so they could return to work. Almost everything we typically had done had to change. Parents are no longer allowed in the building, special classes had to be cancelled, and schedules and procedures had to be adjusted. We now check staff and children's temperatures before they enter the building.

Our staff wears masks all day as they interact, teach, and play with our children. Both our teachers and parents have been amazingly supportive, and everyone is doing their part to make a difficult situation the best it can be. Our sweet children have adjusted quickly to our new normal. Since they cannot wear masks, we still get to see their smiling faces each day.

We do ask for the church's prayers as we move forward during this time. There is no way you can have children between the ages of 2 months and 4 years social distance. We have many staff members who are in the high-risk category, but they show up everyday ready to receive their children with love. Our enrollment dropped by 31 students in a matter of weeks, so adjustments had to be made as we started our new school year. We have received donations from families and church members during this time that has helped us as we work to move forward. God has blessed us, and we continue to see Him at work. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.
