

#### ON BEING A DISCIPLE AND A PILGRIM

In his book, *A Long*Obedience in the Same

Direction, Eugene

Peterson postulates that today's popular approach to Christianity is as one of a

tourist's mindset. Everyone is in a hurry with a passion for the immediate looking for a new experience, a new personality or a new approach to expand their otherwise humdrum lives. This has led to wholesale anemic faith, particularly in the Western church. Friedrich Nietzsche observed this and wrote: "The essential thing 'in heaven and earth' is. . . that there should be long obedience in the same direction; there thereby results, and has always resulted in the long run, something which has made life worth living." Yet our world at its instant gratification pace does not adhere to this well.

How then do we as Christ followers redirect our spiritual journeys toward a deeper faith? Again, Peterson points us in the direction of Scripture. Two biblical designations are disciple and pilgrim. A disciple is a learner along the lines of an

apprentice. The apprentice learns by watching and practicing what the mentor has perfected and, through the long following, learns the trade.

A pilgrim is one who spends life going someplace. As pilgrims we Christ followers are on the path to God and the place He has prepared for His people.

Jesus has told us He is the way, the truth and the life. It is by Him that we get to the Father. It is a journey that has a beginning; that is when we turn towards Him and begin to follow. And it is a long journey following Him until we reach our home.

Both Nietzsche and Peterson were on to something. We are to be on a long journey of obedience in the same direction if we are to make this life worth living, reaching our destination more fully developed as children of God.

Let us encourage one another as we journey together toward home.
