WELCOME TO CHURCH

As I have watched the series The Chosen, I have become more aware of our Christ's interactions with individuals. Jesus embraced people. Whether rich or poor, fisherman or

stonemason, thief or prostitute such as Mary of Magdala, of high estate or a traitor like Matthew, the Messiah looked past the external into the deepest need of the person. It is difficult for us to do that. In fact, when left to our own devices, we categorize everyone. People are classified by outward appearance (clothing, tattoos, vehicles, address), judged by speech (rural or cultured accents, crude language or highly educated, English or *name a language*), job position, denomination or political affiliation.

Thirteen times in the New Testament we are instructed to love one another. The greatest commandment given by Christ Himself was "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

This is so hard to do, yet we are told that we as Christ-followers will be known by the way we love one another. So how do we love this way? By following Christ. By seeking His way. By asking Him to continually give us a new heart. When we think

of the twelve disciples, there were Peter and Andrew the fishermen; James and John the "sons of thunder;" Matthew traitor to Rome in the eyes of the Jews; Thomas, the consummate naysayer, and we also know there were many others including Mary Magdalene, Mary and Martha, James the small - all with different backgrounds, different persuasions and certainly different goals for the future, yet Christ used them to begin His Kingdom on earth.

If we are to be Christ-followers then we must strive to be like Him in the way we love, not only those who are a part of this family of Spring Hill but those who need a family like Spring Hill, a little part of the Kingdom of God.

Let the following be our invitation:

Welcome to Church.
This is a place of love and hope and safety and forgiveness.
We will be food for the hungry,
Living water for the thirsty.
We are so glad you are here.
You are invited.
You are loved.
Come on in – we've been waiting for you.
Welcome here.
Welcome to Christ.
Welcome to His church.
