




Please join us as we serve the women at *McKemie Place* on **Thursday, December 3**. Bring your favorite salad, side dish



WHEN IN DOUBT, FOLLOW JESUS

MOBILE, ALABAMA

John 1

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it...

9 The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. 10 He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. 11 He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. 12 Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—13 children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Today, Christians are fortunate to have multiple copies of what we call the Holy Bible. For most Protestants it contains the Old and New Testaments. For a few Protestants and most Catholics in addition to the Old and New Testaments, the Apocrypha is included for reference.

For centuries man has debated Scripture and its meaning. People with genuine desire to know God's truth and God's will have been on opposing sides in these debates. It is good to ask questions, to seek answers, to research, to pray and to listen. At times godly people and good friends disagree on how some Scriptures are interpreted. However, for centuries, most Christians agree on the following:

God, the Father is the almighty creator of heaven and earth. Jesus

Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; and descended to the dead. On the third day He rose again; He ascended into heaven, He is seated at the right hand of the Father, and He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Through Him, God sent the Holy Spirit, by whom we have a universal Church and together are considered the Body of Christ who is our Head. Through Christ we have forgiveness of sins and a promise of everlasting life.

Christ is the Living Word. In the Gospels, He called people to follow Him and to make disciples of others as He has done with us. Christ did not call us to be "Christians" He called us to be disciples. The word Christian occurs only 3 times in the New Testament, but disciple occurs more than 250 times. He called us to follow Him. So, if there is a question regarding Scripture written by one of the apostles, refer back to what Christ did. How did He treat people? How did He love? What were Christ's instructions and words? Even the apostle Paul reminded the Corinthian church of this very issue in the third chapter of 1 Corinthians.

What would happen if we truly started following Christ and His leading? I challenge each of us to reread the four Gospels. Look for Christ's actions and His words. For He was the living word in infinity before any scripture was written.

Look for Christ at church Sunday, and oh, by the way, bring Him with you too.
