## TRUSTING IN THE "NO"

Despite what social media may lead us to believe, we all have disappointments and heartbreak. Sometimes, prior to a disappointment, we have prayed and prayed that the outcome would be different. "Dear God, please help me get this promotion or job. Please heal this hurt, disease, broken heart. Please salvage this marriage or friendship. Please help my child be accepted into this program, make the team, get the scholarship."

Does God hear our prayers? Always. Does He answer our prayers? Absolutely. Does He always grant what we ask? No. No, He doesn't, and that's where things get real, because if we aren't careful, prayers that are answered with a resounding "no" can lead to a crisis of faith for us.

When God says "no" after we have earnestly and fervently prayed for something, we shake our heads (maybe even our fists) in disbelief and then the questions begin. The questions absolutely consume us. Did I not pray hard enough? Did I pray the wrong way? Is this some sort of punishment? Why did You say "yes" to someone else? Is the one you said "yes" to a better person, Christian, mom, dad? Do You love me? Do You care how this makes me feel? I'm trying so hard to follow You – for what? If we're really honest, we feel like God has hurt our feelings, and there's nothing about feeling that way that feels good. Doesn't He care about us?

Then to add insult to injury, there's the social media post applauding God for answering his/her prayer, and of course, the answer was "yes." You never see a post where someone is praising God for slamming a door shut or saying "no" to something you thought you really needed or something that you thought was so right for your life. In fact, sometimes we're tempted to believe that prayers are always answered with a "yes" and that's such a dangerous, false temptation, because when we are told "no," we're not always sure what to do with that. Sometimes, the "no" is so, so painful in the moment.

So what do we do when God has said "no" and we're drowning in the "whys" and ever so subtly our faith begins to waver and we find ourselves at the intersection of what we know to be true about God and how we feel in that moment? We cling with white knuckles to what we know to be true about God. We trace God's fingerprints through our past with Him and proclaim what we know of Him. Do we believe He is good? Do we believe that He loves us with a love that we simply can't fathom? Do we believe that He knows the bigger picture? Do we believe that He knows what we need more than we do? Have we seen Him shut a door, because there was something better down the road? Can

## LISTENING - THE BEGINNING OF LOVING

Our Christ scandalized the first century culture by showing love. He chose to engage with enemies of "the righteous ones" by eating with tax collectors and sinners. He engaged with those who had been "tainted" by their worldly practices. Jesus touched the leper and heard the cry of those suffering whether physically or spiritually.

It wasn't the oppressive Roman government that Jesus stood against but the oppressive rule of the religious who should have known better. Why else would they consider him a threat? They had chosen to corroborate with Rome in order to keep their power to the neglect of those who needed God the most. They had turned a deaf ear to the cries of the sick, the outcasts and the lonely sinners caught in the traps of their own sin. Rather than offering hope, they offered only condemnation.

Conversely, Christ entered the scene and heard the cry. Time and again we see His response to the lonely broken-hearted ones, the blind beggar, the sinful woman, Matthew, Zacchaeus, the widow, the bent over woman, and the paralytic to name a few. Jesus Himself wept over the hopeless despair of the people of Jerusalem. Even when they weren't calling for Him, He could hear their heart's cry.

We as Christ-ones are called to love, but if we aren't listening, how can we hear the needs and respond. Love takes time. Love takes patient listening. Love means often being silent and sitting without offering some trite solution or pious scripture quoted in haste. It is hard to hear the needs of individuals when everyone is shouting, so we must train ourselves to tune in. That training comes from spending time with God connecting with His heart so we can connect with others.

Many times, we presume to know another but until we listen, actively listen, we truly don't know. Consider what others value; ask about their fears, experiences, perspective. Listen without judging. Really hear their heart. Then, allow the Holy Spirit to guide in responding in love.

I'll practice this more and encourage you to join me in it as well.
