

HAVE YOU GROWN OUT OF FAITH?

As a child it was easy to believe in God, in love and in laughter. For children, more is unknown than known. Mystery for a child is exciting and wonderous. But for adults, we "know better." As adults we struggle with faith. Oh, we want to believe, but we also want to control. Just like the Pharisees we build elaborate dogmas to help bolster our personal theology and supposedly support our souls so we can reach the God whom we desperately need. But too often we construct Him in our own image: therefore, He is an impotent God in our eyes.

Please hear me when I say that we are to study, to read, to seek the truth from Scripture and from those whom God has given great minds and theological insights; however, we must never place God in a small reliquary to use to defend our selfish wants. This is not faith. Never would any of us intentionally make a choice to treat God in this manner. Unfortunately, many of us do not grow into faith, but grow out of it. As Erwin McManus has said, "Most of us don't sell our souls to the devil; we just slowly give them away."

Scientist tell us that the universe is constantly expanding into a vastness that we can never fully reach. I propose that when God created us, He intended the same for our souls. The mystery of faith comes when we learn that He loves us infinitely more than we can imagine. The Father's desire was to show us not only His love for us but to open us up to the unending possibilities available to us if we embrace His love, trust that He is working for our good and begin to allow ourselves to be drawn to the mystery of His heart. In our world this is difficult to do, for our focus is drawn to the immediate crises, many on which

we have no real influence. We forget to look to the One who holds the world and the future. We lose our desire for mystery, and therefore our expectancy of God's intervention dissolves to the mundane challenges. Elizabeth Barrett Browning expresses this succinctly:

"Earth's crammed with heaven, And every common bush afire with God, But only he who sees takes off his shoes; The rest sit round and pluck blackberries."

We as God's children are chosen to do more than to simply survive; we are empowered to thrive. Let's take the challenge. Ask your Father to give you the heart, the wonder and the excitement and faith of a child, and in the midst of all that is swirling violently around us, grasp hold of the mystery and power of our Almighty God.

Jesus called a little child to His side and set him on His feet in the middle of them all. "Believe me," He said, "unless you change your whole outlook and become like little children you will never enter the kingdom of Heaven. It is the man who can be as humble as this little child who is greatest in the kingdom of Heaven.
