WISDOM FROM A YOUNG MAN

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. 2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Romans 12:1-2

In conversation with a much younger friend this week we discussed the changes that COVID 19 had brought to the family. He is the father of 7, has an incredibly busy schedule with his profession and, before COVID, spent many weeks away from home because of his profession. He remembered when he was first quarantined; he was confused and worried as all of us were but stated that the adjustment has been remarkable. Prior to the lockdown the family was running from one sport or event to another, trying to keep up with schoolwork, falling in bed exhausted only to get up and do it over again. The kids were expected to be in everything and excel and enjoy it. He regretted the number of events he missed with his children because of work. However, in the last few months he noticed that things were much calmer in his home. The kids seemed more content. As a family they had spent time together, really gotten to know one another, played games together and encouraged one another.

He commented on how wonderfully refocused they had become. And added that, when the virus finally is under control, he doesn't ever want to go back to the full throttle existence they had before.

I found it surprisingly refreshing that a busy and successful young adult would say this. We all want to "get back to normal" and "go full throttle," or so I thought. But what he said make sense. Families need togetherness, children need free time away from being driven to succeed, away from electronics, away from schedules. We all need this. As we begin the return to regathering, may we all hold on to community, face-to-face interaction, time of rest, time of play, time of worshipping together as a family and as a community. Let our greatest focus be on following the message of Christ to love God and love one another and, in doing so, to allow Him to work in us to do His will.
