On the Dominican Republic Mission Trip in 2019, I had the opportunity to spend a couple of hours each day with the family that we sponsor. It was a little awkward at the beginning of the week as we struggled to get to know one another through the help of an interpreter, but as the week progressed, we really became friends.

On my final day with them, the mom asked through the interpreter if I was "flying away" the next day. He told her that I was. She then asked him when I'd be coming back. I told her that I hoped to return about the same time the next year. She then told the interpreter, "Well, tell her that we'll be sitting right here waiting for her to come back." When the interpreter told me what she said, I was so overwhelmed with gratitude that God's Spirit had transcended all the possible barriers between this family and me and allowed us to genuinely grow to love one another in a week's time. I was also struck by the realization that sometimes it is imperative that we "go" to share the love of Christ, because some people truly can't go anywhere than right where they are. They simply can't "come" to us. After Jesus' Resurrection, His last words before He ascended into Heaven were for us to "go and make disciples." Of all the final

instructions He could have left us with, He simply said "go." Of course, our life's circumstances may not allow us to travel internationally to a people group that have no other way of knowing Jesus if we don't, but there are so many ways we can "go" right where we are. There are so many people stuck emotionally, physically, and relationally in situations that are beyond their control. We can go take a meal to the family down the street who is struggling with illness. We can befriend the parent sitting by himself at the ballpark who is dealing with a divorce. We can reach out to the family in our Sunday School class who just hasn't connected with other families yet. We can treat a coworker to coffee who is going through a difficult time committing to pray with him through the situation. We can offer to babysit for an overwhelmed mom whose husband travels a good bit for work.

As we move forward from the Easter season and the celebration of Christ's resurrection, let's ask Him where He wants us to "go" in His name remembering that He won't ask us to go anywhere that He won't be with us, and that He'll equip us in every way to go where He has called us to "go."
