






#### CHASING THE WILD GOOSE



The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit. John 3:8

MOBILE, ALABAMA

My four-year-old Anne Catchings was immersed in a world known only to her as she sang and talked, moved from place to place, picked

up objects and engaged in conversations quite real to her but unseen by me. Her eyes twinkled; she laughed, danced, ran, and jumped joyfully following the spirit within her. The freedom she had in that period of imaginative play was delightful to watch, and how I wished I could have been in that world with her.

The early Celtic Christians saw the presence of God in nature and compared the leading of the Holy Spirit to chasing the wild goose. The wild goose would arrive and stay for a while then vanish for periods at a time. The goose was loud and unpredictable and sometimes could be frightening with seemingly erratic behavior. Their concept of the Holy Spirit was just as unpredictable as the wild goose, yet the challenge was to follow or "chase" the spirit and lose themselves in the pursuit. In fact, they referred to it as Chasing the Wild Goose. In particular, an order of monks in Iona began to dedicate themselves to that pursuit, learning to listen to God and follow

the Spirit.

As North Americans, we are more conditioned to following the clock, the schedule and being punctual. Instead of chasing the Spirit, we want Him to work within our parameters. It is unsettling for us to follow when one doesn't know the destination, path or outcome. Trusting is difficult. But isn't that what we are called to do? To trust.

Trust comes from being in relationship with someone, having experience with the individual and being confident they have our best interest at heart. That kind of trust takes time. It takes testing. Could it be we don't follow the Spirit because we haven't spent time in relationship with God? Only by spending time with God, following Him in the little things, can we understand the freedom of following Him in the bigger things. Maybe we should consider asking Him to help us in that pursuit. Before we can fully chase the wild goose, we must be willing to trust the One who is leading. Just imagine what could happen if we were to begin to Chase the Wild Goose. Is it possible that we could try? What would it be worth for us? How would we be changed? How could our world be changed?

What would it be like to be lost in following the Spirit, Chasing the Wild Goose? Could we find the same joy that that four-yearold Anne Catchings found?

Let's try it!
