Dear Spring Hill Family,

In October of 2019, when a vacancy occurred, I agreed to take on the responsibilities of Administrator in addition to my Associate Pastor responsibilities. As I had served previously for 11 years, I was familiar with general operations of SHBC. Staff and the church has been incredibly supportive throughout this time, particularly as we don't have a senior pastor and through the COVID 19 dilemma.

April first of this year, my wife, Pat was diagnosed with stage four pancreatic cancer and began intensive chemo cycles. Through this time the church has been so encouraging and sensitive to our family. The tumors have responded well to the treatment; however, the past two weeks have been very challenging with Pat's illness. The end of last week I began wondering if there could be a temporary solution that could help with church administration and allow me not to feel so scattered at this time. Sunday, I received a call from Jim Murrill and Scott Browning about the proposal of an interim. At first, I had reservations, but upon learning that the candidate was Paul McLendon, I was put more at ease. Paul is not only a well proven administrator, as exhibited by his long, successful tenure at VOA; Paul has the heart of a minister of Christ. He and I have worked together in the past on a couple of projects, and I have a great respect and trust for him and look forward to working with him. I will continue my responsibilities as Associate Pastor and this will give me the opportunity to focus more on the priority of pastoral ministry.

As always, my concern for the well-being of Spring Hill is a priority. I agree that this is a positive solution for the time being and look to the future as Spring Hill returns to full staff and operations.
