SOUTHERN ETIQUETTE AND CHURCH



I was raised in the post WWII era in Tupelo, Mississippi, a smaller North Mississippi county seat town with a heritage of southern grace. Thus, I am well acquainted with southern culture life. Mother and her three sisters were stalwart members of the community. They were often mentioned in the "social page"

of the Daily Journal, and when I read it now, it is quite humorous. Quotes such as: "Mrs. So-and-so presided over the punch bowl at the event." Really? Yes, really! I digress.

Much was expected of them and, of course, of their children. As such I was trained in the ways of the 9th edition of Emily Post's The Blue Book of Social Usage. For those unfamiliar, it was the ultimate rule of etiquette. I often say that if the Bible and Emily Post were pitted against one another, Emily Post won out. Those of us who have experienced this culture understand that there is much to appreciate about the gracious southern culture. I miss much of what was the beautiful, warm and inviting part of it.
