Report from Pastor Search Committee

Since being formed by a vote of the congregation, the Pastor Search Committee has been actively seeking to find that pastor chosen by God to lead Spring Hill Baptist Church into the future. To successfully complete this task, the Committee has identified a process to be followed and specific goals to be accomplished within the process.

First, and most importantly, the Committee has unanimously embraced a commitment to prayer. Finding God's leader must involve a connection with the Holy Spirit through prayer and being receptive to the Spirit's guidance. This connection, we believe, is enhanced by the efforts of our prayer leader to focus the individual prayers of the committee members into a specific area of need each week. Our focus for this week is to again ask the congregation to continue to pray for the selection process and for the committee members. In addition, please pray that God will work among us as a church family to strengthen us and prepare us for His chosen leader. 1 Peter 2:4-5.

As has been reported during the monthly church conferences, other goals set by the Committee have been accomplished. The Committee has been organized, a budget has been adopted and the input of the congregation regarding the desired characteristics of a new pastor has been received and analyzed. These efforts have led to the development of a pastor profile and a church profile. The pastor profile will enhance an organized analysis by the Committee of the characteristics of the prospective pastors that have been identified. The church profile will be helpful in presenting a unified response from Committee members to common questions that will be asked by prospective pastors. It will also serve as a resource for the new pastor to use as he and his family move into the family of SHBC. It may also prove to be useful in providing information to future visitors and new members.

The Committee has also collected a list of prospective pastors for consideration. This list has come from trusted friends of SHBC that not only know the prospective pastors but know SHBC. Once these prospects were identified, the Committee proceeded to research each pastor by checking for information available in the public domain and watching sermons via the internet.

The public research has led the Committee to contact those pastors that appear to fit within the profile and ask them to submit a resume. For those that have submitted resumes, indicating an interest in SHBC, the Committee is now developing a sub list of pastors to be contacted and specific questions for them to respond to in advance of an interview. The interview process will be probing and designed to gain insight into whether a particular prospect has been chosen to lead SHBC.

The Committee is very grateful for the support shown to us by the congregation and are encouraged by your continued prayers for the work ahead.


