As we were finishing 2021, we were all anticipating a new year, a

new chapter, and looking to turn the page on COVID, quarantine, vaccines, and masks. We were looking forward to crowded games, full worship services, parties and dinners void of social distancing. Yet, on this the 24th of January 2022, infection numbers increase along with frustration and disappointment. Mixed messages come daily from the media with the latest reports on protocols. Some have thrown their hands up, ripped off their masks and returned to routines recklessly. Others, paralyzed by fear, are awaiting apocalypse. Truly we often don't know what is best.

Pat and I, because of her compromised health, continue to isolate and watch services online and long to be back at church, for we go nowhere except the doctor. We want things to return to normal! Yet the path still is uphill and dimly lit. Often it may seem for all of us that we've been left to our own devices. Yet as I read from the Psalter that Christ Himself studied and read, I began to have a sense of comfort and hope.

Songs of Hope

You and I are not the first of God's beloved to struggle, nor will we be the last. These songs written between the ninth and fifth centuries BC reveal the depth of humanity's pain and the place where God's people eventually turn when all seems hopeless. The writers remind us of God's faithfulness to His people and His constant presence. Therefore, I encourage each of us to return to the Psalter and take to heart what is revealed in the songs.

I commend to you Psalm 34. As I read it tonight, I again felt the hope that only can come from our ever-faithful Father. So, in this time of uncertainty, be encouraged by Scripture, and if physically possible, do not abandon meeting with your community of faith, worshiping together, encouraging one another, and praying for one another. We are not alone, nor are we abandoned by God. He is here amid our struggles, our questions, and our fears. When we turn toward Him, we find He is closer than our breath. So, be encouraged! Turn once again to His word. Hear Him speak, feel His presence, embrace His comfort, then share it with one another.
